SLOCAT was established in 2009 by the pioneers of our movement as an outcome of the Bellagio Process and since then has been served by a full-time professional secretariat. In 2014, SLOCAT acquired legal personality through the incorporation of SLOCAT Foundation into Dutch law.

Today, our Partnership engages a vibrant international, multi-stakeholder ecosystem of over 90 entities across transport sectors associations, knowledge and academia, governments, multilateral organisations, NGOs, philanthropy and industry; as well as a large community of world-class experts and change-makers.

Foreword

Dear colleagues and friends of the SLOCAT Partnership,

In 2021, the movement towards sustainable, low carbon transport and mobility that we champion continued to operate despite the shadow of the COVID-19 pandemic The SLOCAT Partnership focused more than ever on delivering impactful and actionable knowledge and policy analysis, advocacy and dialogue on the opportunities and challenges towards transforming transport systems.

The SLOCAT Key Transformations for Sustainable, Low Carbon Land Transport were launched as a messaging framework that articulates the 11 key transformations necessary to enable sustainable, low carbon land transport; especially considering the availability of solutions and the urgency with which action must be taken.

From early last year, the SLOCAT Secretariat leveraged efforts to refocus on an integrated, intermodal and balanced application of the *Avoid-Shift-Improve* framework in order to harness the growing interest in transport, climate, equity and societal resilience. As outlined in the SLOCAT Strategic Development Plan 2020-2022, SLOCAT aims to help catalyse *Avoid* measures, accelerate *Shift* actions and broaden *Improve* perspectives. For instance, the SLOCAT Secretariat initiated collaborations around two and three-wheeled vehicles as one way to support transport decarbonisation efforts and access to mobility in the Global South. Moreover, SLOCAT engaged in the European Investment Bank's Transport Lending Policy review.

Over the past year, SLOCAT initiated work on the **transport-renewables nexus** towards the **phasing out of fossil fuel subsidies and investments**, and the **scaling up of renewables in transport**. A **SLOCAT Summary Analysis** of strategies for transport and an initial set of **SLOCAT Country Factsheets** were launched. Moreover, we worked with old and new partners on decision-making tools for the **transport-health-climate nexus** in order to scale up healthy low carbon transport measures and lifestyles across different geographies and income levels.

The SLOCAT Transport and Climate Change Global Status Report - 2nd edition, "Tracking Trends in a Time of Change: The Need for Radical Action Towards Sustainable Transport Decarbonisation", was launched and is still enjoying large success. This flagship knowledge report tells the global and regional stories of where we are and where we need to get to urgently on climate action in the transport sector. With contributions from more than 150 world-class experts and organisations, it is a one-stop shop for the latest available data, targets and developments on transport demand, emissions, policies and measures – showing that it is imperative to accelerate radical action for sustainable transport and climate in this time of unprecedented global change.

With a view to tracking, understanding and influencing sustainable, low carbon transport ambition and action, SLOCAT continued enabling national climate and sustainability strategies, amongst other activities, with regular assessments of Nationally Determined Contributions and Long-term Strategies of the Paris Agreement and Voluntary National Reviews on the implementation of the Sustainable Development Goals.

SLOCAT delivered on its regional engagement by bringing regional needs into global arenas; by enhancing the implementation of global frameworks at the regional and local levels and by supporting prominent regional initiatives such as the NDC Transport Initiative for Asia, the Asian Transport Outlook by the Asian Development Bank, the EUROCLIMA+ Programme for Latin America, the Low Emission Development Strategies Global Partnership and the Africa Walking and Cycling Network.

To align our multiple interactions in the UNFCCC process - from UN Conferences on Climate Change COPs and Regional Climate Weeks, to Co-Focal Point services in the Marrakech Partnership for Global Climate Action - 2021 saw the introduction of the SLOCAT Strategy Engagement in UNFCCC 2021-2025. As analysed in the SLOCAT Report on COP26 Outcomes for Sustainable, Low Carbon Transport, in Glasgow, our Partnership and the wider sustainable, low carbon transport movement enjoyed growing credibility, influence and increased cooperation among actors within and beyond the transport community.

The above are just a few highlights about the life of SLOCAT in 2021 but they would not be complete without celebrating the arrival of Climate Chance, Environmental Defense Fund, Smart Freight Centre, Trans-Consult and the United Nations Environment Programme to our vibrant, international, multi-stakeholder Partnership of change-makers.

At this critical juncture, we, the SLOCAT Board of Directors and Secretariat, are determined to enable a lasting positive transformation of transport and mobility for the benefit of the people and the planet. We would like to express our gratitude to SLOCAT partners and funders for their confidence in SLOCAT's mission and results during this uncertain time. We feel confident about the power towards positive transformation that lies in our collective coordination and collaboration.

We invite you to take a moment to read and share our Partnership's 2021 achievements, as we seek to empower change-makers everywhere to deliver on sustainable, low carbon transport for a green, equitable recovery.



SLOCAT Key Transformations for Sustainable, Low Carbon Land Transport

This SLOCAT messaging framework articulates the 11 key transformations necessary to enable sustainable, low carbon land transport; especially considering the availability of solutions and the urgency with which action must be taken. Under each of the 11 key transformations, connections with ongoing wider socio-economic transformations towards a sustainable, low carbon future are outlined.

The key transformations for sustainable, low carbon land transport: What needs to change



Overarching Approaches to apply across transport modes and sub-sectors overtime

- Put people first, not technology
- Co-create and communicate a compelling vision and targets
- Guide short- and medium-term action with clear, coherent policies and messages
- Coordinate and synergise policies across transport and with other sectors
- Prioritise action by social and environmental value for money
- Engage, empower and coordinate stakeholders across levels of government and sectors
- Build capacity to improve knowledge and data
- Implement pilots to learn and share, then scale solutions

Developed in co-leadership by the SLOCAT Secretariat, the FIA Foundation, Institute for Transportation and Development Policy (ITDP), MobiliseYourCity and World Resources Institute (WRI); in the framework of the SLOCAT Task Force for UNFCCC Engagement, and with the financial support of FIA Foundation. Following extensive open consultation across the SLOCAT Partnership on the drafts elaborated by external consultant Stefanie Sohm, this messaging framework was adopted in October 2021.

SLOCAT Task Force on Transport Community Engagement in the UNFCCC

Effective and consistent engagement of transport stakeholders to accelerate the implementation of the Paris Agreement on Climate Change.

Five-Year Strategy for Engagement in the UNFCCC

The Five-year Engagement Strategy focuses on our multiple interactions in the UNFCCC process (e.g. official events, consultations, UN Conferences on Climate Change COPs, Regional Climate Weeks, Marrakech Partnership for Global Climate Action (MPGCA), technical workshops) and aligns our activities with the five-year cycle of the Paris Agreement.

- Initiated by the SLOCAT Secretariat in the framework of the SLOCAT UNFCCC Engagement Task Force, the final version was released in September 2021; following an open consultation across the Partnership.
- Eight principles for successful engagement: Consistent, Competent, Timely, Relevant, Related, Equitable and Inclusive and Robust.
- Focuses on the whole year-long UNFCCC process rather than on specific physical meetings, with wide variety of engagement methods.
- SLOCAT's role as Co-Focal Point for the engagement of the Transport Sector in the Marrakech Partnership for Global Climate Action (MPGCA) is separate but complementary to the strategy (more information in the next section).



2021 UN Climate Change Conference (COP26)

31 October - 12 November I Glasgow, Scotland

SLOCAT provided thought leadership and advocacy to shape the global sustainable, low carbon transport agenda at COP26, with growing credibility, influence and increased cooperation with our Partners and actors within and beyond the transport community.







SLOCAT Report "COP26 Outcomes for Sustainable, Low Carbon Transport"

The report identifies key open questions on the implications of various transportrelevant outcomes at COP26. These open questions are intended to help capitalise on the advancements and identify areas requiring further work in the run-up to COP27. The report provides a critical analysis of the transport-relevant content of the Glasgow Climate Pact, the official outcome document of COP26. It also offers a preliminary analysis of the major transport initiatives and commitments that were launched on the occasion of the Conference, cross-referencing them with the new Nationally Determined Contributions (NDCs) submitted by countries which signed up to these initiatives. This preliminary analysis shows that overall the NDCs of signatory countries are not aligned with the initiatives they have signed up to. With no aspiration of honouring the multitude of transport events that took place - thanks to the impressive mobilisation and engagement of SLOCAT Partners and the wider transport community; last but not least, this report includes summaries of a select number of events.

Preliminary Analysis of Coherence Between Commitments and Initiatives Launched at COP26 and the NDCs of Signatory Countries

Are NDCs aligned with the commitments and initiatives on transport announced on the occasion of COP26? The SLOCAT Secretariat cross-referenced transport commitments and initiatives announced at COP26 with the new NDCs submitted by countries which signed up to the initiatives. The preliminary analysis shows that overall the NDCs of signatory countries are not aligned with the initiatives they have signed up to.

Marrakech Partnership for Global Climate Action

Serving as Co-Focal Point of the Transport Thematic Group jointly with ITF, SLOCAT establishes the transport community as an essential partner in MPGCA. SLOCAT's mandate was renewed by appointment by transport sector peers in 2020.

Enhanced Regional Engagement

SLOCAT delivered on its regional engagement by bringing regional needs into global arenas; by enhancing the implementation of global frameworks at the regional and local levels and by supporting prominent regional initiatives. We strived to raise visilibily of our regional partners to showcase climate actions and faciliating nuanced peer dialogue and learning.

UNFCCC Regional Climate Weeks

Africa Climate Week 2021 | 26 - 29 September

SLOCAT, under the lead of United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP), co-organised three official thematic sessions with the Transport Decarbonisation Alliance (TDA), New Horizons Women's Education Centre and WRI Africa to explore the following issues:

- Transport and climate action outlook to 2050,
- Policies for behaviour change and technology development, and
- Financing the shift to sustainable, low and zero emissions mobility.

SLOCAT led the Implementation Lab on Transport with ITF and presented the Africa section of the SLOCAT Global Status Report on Transport and Climate Change - 2nd edition at a side event organised by Climate Chance.

Asia Pacific Climate Week 2021 I 6 - 9 July

SLOCAT co-organised three official thematic sessions with UNEP, NDC Transport Initiative for Asia (NDC-TIA), Asia LEDS Partnership and others, which featured many SLOCAT partners and their works to explore the policy, technical and fiscal measures needed to accelerate the transition to sustainable, low carbon mobility in Asia-Pacific.

SLOCAT also co-organised a side event on small island states with the Asia LEDS Partnership and discussed the challenges in tracking sustainable transport trends in the region at the Session on Behaviour Change and Technology Development.

Latin America and the Caribbeans Regional Climate Week I 11-14 May

SLOCAT, in partnership with EUROCLIMA+ and the regional urban mobility community of practice, contributed to the transport and mobility programme organised by UNEP and highlighted best practices in local and national governance, active mobility and urban freight. The SLOCAT secretariat contributed as keynote speaker, moderator and panellist.









Intergovernmental Regional Environmentally Sustainable Transport (EST) Forum in Asia

18 - 20 October I Aichi, Japan

- Facilitation of policy dialogues and best practices, policy instruments, tools, technologies among EST member countries in Asia.
- Technical input, strategic recommendations, and event organisation and facilitation.
- Co-organisation of the Pre-event on Decarbonising Asia's Transport Sector -- How to deliver on Goal 1a of the Aichi 2030 Declaration with the United Nations Centre for Regional Development (UNCRD), the Asian Development Bank (ADB) and GIZ as part of NDC-TIA funded by the German Federal Ministry for the Environment, Nature Conservation, Building and Nuclear Safety's International Climate Initiative.
- SLOCAT, ADB and NDC-TIA presented the Council for Decarbonising Transport in Asia and shared insights on sustainable transport solutions for increased resilience in the Forum's plenary.



Avoid-Shift-Improve Refocusing Strategy

The SLOCAT Secretariat continues leveraging existing efforts to refocus on the *Avoid-Shift-Improve* (ASI) framework: Catalyse *Avoid* - Accelerate *Shift* - Broaden *Improve*. A collective multi-stakeholder process anchored in equity and climate action was established with SLOCAT task force of partners to refined the ASI narrative, integrating decades of experience and harnessing momentum on pandemic green equitable recovery.

The ASI framework calls for:



Avoiding unnecessary motorised trips based on proximity and accessibility.



Shifting to less carbon-intensive modes – from private vehicles to public transport, shared mobility, walking and cycling, water-based freight, electrified road-rail freight, and cargo bikes for last-mile deliveries, among others.




Improving vehicle design, energy efficiency and clean energy sources for different types of freight and passenger vehicles.







This report analyses trends in the transport decarbonisation ambition, targets and actions in the climate strategies submitted by countries in the framework of the Paris Agreement. Specifically, the analysis focuses on LTS starting from 2016 and on NDCs starting from 2019. On the basis of the analysis, the report seeks to establish to what extent climate action in transport by countries is on track to deliver on the Paris Agreement goal of limiting global warming below 1.5 °C. The report also identifies gaps and shortcomings in the transport dimension of these national climate strategies; while it provides recommendations on how to enhance it.

SLOCAT Analysis of SDGs Voluntary National Reviews 2021

Since the first UN High-Level Political Forum on Sustainable Development in 2016, SLOCAT has been assessing transport references in the VNRs submitted each year by countries.

40 countries presented their VNRs at the 2021 HLPF and all of them include references to sustainable transport policies and measures to realise the SDGs for the first time since the inaugural HLPF in 2016. It shows that countries see transport action as a vital component for the implementation of the 2030 Agenda.

The report tracks the transport pattern, gaps and opportunities in VNRs reporting, especially the COVID-19 impacts and responses to implement the SDGs. A new regional dimension was introduced to analyse how transport was reported based on the four themes of the SLOCAT Wheel on Transport and the SDGs.

SLOCAT is a core partner of the UNEP Electromobility Programme which supports electric two- and three -wheeler projects in 16 countries in Africa and Asia and Latin America and the Caribbean.

Participation in the Global Working Group on Electric Two and Three-Wheelers, which aims to support the development of global and regional targets, provide policy advice on e-mobility standards and regulations, and develop project tools.

Financial Update: Letter from the Treasurer of the SLOCAT Board of Directors

Dear Fellow SLOCAT Partners,

In my capacity as the Treasurer of the Board of Directors of the SLOCAT Foundation, I would like to present to you updates on the state of SLOCAT's finances and highlight some positive achievements.

Current Financial Year 2021-2022 (from 1 July 2021 to 31 December 2021)

- During this first half of the financial year, the SLOCAT Secretariat has maintained a balanced budget between expenses
 and income, fully covering its July-December 2021 expenses with the income generated or allocated for the same
 period.
- In addition the income generated during this period, the starting bank balance and funding received for future periods have formed a stable cash-flow situation for the organisation.
- This is a significant step in the consolidation of the medium-term financial stability that SLOCAT initiated in the past couple of years.
- During this first half of the financial year, the SLOCAT Secretariat has utilised 51.6% of its projected expense,
- We have a good outlook for the remainder of the fiscal year. The current estimates indicate that the expenses will be fully covered by the income generated or allocated for Financial Year 2021-2022.
- Annual Support Fees received from SLOCAT partners still constitute the most flexible funding source the Partnership
 has. On behalf of the SLOCAT Board of Directors, partners are kindly encouraged to maintain this support. A warm thank
 you is extended to partners who are doing so over the years.
- Any potential reserve maintained at the end of the fiscal year will be used for institutional strengthening and furthering the incremental buildup of reserve for financial sustainability of the organisation.

Previous Financial Year 2020-2021 (from 1 July 2020 to 30 June 2021)

The overview for the Financial Year 2020-2021 presents a positive outcome. Total expenses amounted to \$1,352,662.89 and total income received or receivable under signed contracts amounted to \$1,555,058.85; leading to an expected surplus of \$232,395.96. Based on the previous Secretariat proposal approved by the Board to progressively build a reserve, it is maintained a \$30,000.00 reserve. The remaining \$202,395.96 is accounted as the net surplus for Financial Year 2020-2021.

As this is likely to be my last communication as Treasurer, I would like to take this opportunity to thank the entire Slocat Community for their commitment, trust and support over this past year and to also and congratulate the SLOCAT Secretariat for achieving such impressive financial results.



Strategic Development Plan 2020-2022

The Strategic Development Plan 2020-2022 builds upon and consolidates the impact achieved by the SLOCAT Partnership; as well as the values that have governed us over the years. At the same time, this Plan proposes shifts to our business model, outlines our intended impacts and objectives for the next three years and lands them in specific catalytic themes and cross-cutting lenses for work at different levels of intensity. It also defines a series of organisation enablers that will nourish our capacity to deliver. In so doing, this Strategic Plan demonstrates one of the defining features of our Partnership: Our ability to evolve within the wider transport landscape, while preserving our recognised flexibility to punch above our weight and retaining focus on our mission of powering the sustainable, low carbon transport revolution with ambition, solutions and collaboration.

The Strategic Development Plan was conceptualised over the course of 2019 under the guidance of our Board of Directors and on the basis of inputs gathered from across the entities in our Partnership and other key actors in the transport landscape. On January 2020, on the occasion of the Board and the Annual Partnership Meetings, the Secretariat released a first draft. A broad consultation was kicked-off at the Annual Meeting. During February 2020 a survey accessible to all partners remained open. Until early March 2020, the Secretariat also held a large number of bilateral meetings with partners and continued collecting inputs from the Board. On the basis of all inputs received, another draft iteration was presented to the Board, leading to adoption at its April 2020 meeting.
