Foreword

Dear colleagues and friends of the SLOCAT Partnership,

2022 was another year of global disruption. It was also another year of positive impact for our Partnership.

Over Summer 2022, our **growing and evolving partnership of action** elected the **SLOCAT** Board of Directors 2022-2025. This gender-, geographical- and background-balanced Board of Directors brings together an extraordinary wealth of expertise and reflects the integrated, inter-modal, multi-dimensional and multi-stakeholder approaches for transforming transport and mobility that SLOCAT champions. The SLOCAT family kept growing and we were thrilled to welcome to our Partnership, **Fundación Centro para la Sostenibilidad Urbana**, **Institute for Sustainable Development and International Relations** (IDDRI) and **Sustentar**. The **SLOCAT Strategic Development Plan 2023-2026** was developed through a year-long participative process. Today, this Plan provides SLOCAT Partners, donors, supporters and secretariat with a clear and coherent multi-annual horizon.

The SLOCAT Key Transformations for Sustainable, Low Carbon Land Transport equipped us with foundational messaging for our advocacy for systemic transformations. For COP27, an African COP, we complemented them with African perspectives and case studies. Besides, the African Voices Towards COP27 blog series featured a wide range of local professionals tackling transport and mobility challenges in Africa with context-adapted and cost-effective solutions. With the Six Actions to Enable Walking, Cycling and Public Transport for People and Planet: A Call to Action by SLOCAT we called on stakeholders to enable walking, cycling and public transport solutions as core elements of their climate action for transport by specific, measurable, attainable, relevant and time-based action in six areas. This call to action was the compass for SLOCAT Transport Day at COP27 - which attracted close to 100 in-person and online participants and a lineup of world-class experts. It also guided SLOCAT secretariat's facilitation tasks around the COP27 Presidency Initiative Low Carbon Transport for Urban Sustainability (LOTUS), under the leadership of Egypt. Alongside our sustained role since 2016 as the Official Co-Focal Point for the Engagement of the Transport Sector in the UNFCCC, 2022 opened a new space for advocacy and community curation & alignment. The United Nations Office for Disaster Risk Reduction invited us to represent the transport sector in their Stakeholder Engagement Mechanism. Because nurturing the interest of young professionals in the field of sustainable, low carbon transport is among our strategic targets, we were proud to select and mentor the third confort of VREF and SLOCAT Young Leaders in Sustainable Transport Programme.

In 2022, the elaboration and synthesis of knowledge to track and influence national and subnational policies remained a fundamental SLOCAT activity. On the basis of the backbone knowledge and data outlined in the SLOCAT Transport and Climate Change Global Status Report - 2nd edition, we elaborated the Infographics Series on Regional Trends and Activities on Sustainable Transport for Africa, Asia, LAC and MENA; as well as our inputs to the UNFCCC Global Stocktake on

the implementation of the Paris Agreement on Climate Change. Building on our transport-renewables nexus country factsheets and analysis released in 2021, we deepened strategic exchanges towards the phasing out of fossil fuel subsidies and investments, and the scaling up of renewables in transport. Besides, in April 2022, we released an update of the SLOCAT E-Mobility Trends and Targets Database. In collaboration with the Health and Climate Network we developed a knowledge base and user guide on transport-health-climate policies to support policy makers to scale up healthy, low carbon transport measures. With the Islamic Development Bank (IsDB) we investigated how social and economic recovery and resilience in IsDB member countries can be accelerated through increased investment in public, shared and active transport.

The national strategies for the implementation of the Paris Climate Change Agreement and the UN 2030 Agenda on Sustainable Development remained an important target for our knowledge tracking and policy influencing activities. In October 2022, we released the latest edition of the Climate Strategies for Transport: An Analysis of Nationally Determined Contributions (NDCs) and Long-Term Strategies; with complementing regional infographics and videos for Africa, Asia, LAC and MENA released throughout the year. With the NDCs Hall of Fame by SLOCAT campaign we put the spotlight on the major transport strengths and issues in the second generation of NDCs. And with Actions to Reduce Emissions and Boost the Resilience of Freight Transport and Global Supply Chains: SLOCAT Guidelines for NDCs, we illustrated how countries can use their NDCs to set their freight transport and logistics systems on track to become net zero and resilient. As we have been doing since 2016, the latest edition of the SLOCAT Report on Transport and 2022 Voluntary National Reviews analysed in detail how countries reported transport measures in their 2022 reviews about the implementation of the SDGs.

During 2022, with the goal of supporting the **implementation of global frameworks at the regional level,** SLOCAT maintained active engagement in prominent regional initiatives such as the EUROCLIMA+ Programme for Latin America, the **Global Climate Action Partnership** and the **NDC Transport Initiative for Asia.** SLOCAT also served as engagement facilitator of Regional Climate Weeks and some key regional conferences.

In these times of change, we, the SLOCAT Board of Directors and the Secretariat, are grateful and inspired with the valuable inputs we have received over the past year during the elaboration of the SLOCAT Strategic Development Plan 2023-2026. We are determined to continue sharpening our impact towards turning the greatest transport, sustainability and climate change challenges that our societies are experiencing into opportunities for systemic transformations. And we are confident about SLOCAT's strength as a respected, neutral, inclusive convener of a multi-sectoral, multi-stakeholder ecosystem of change-makers.

We invite you to take a moment to read and share our Partnership's 2022 achievements, as we seek to empower change-makers towards systemic transformations in transport and mobility.

Towards the SLOCAT Strategic Development Plan 2023-2026

The SLOCAT Strategic Development Plan 2023 - 2026 was developed through a year-long participative process under the guidance of the SLOCAT Board of Directors. The elaboration process kicked off in February 2022 at the SLOCAT Partnership Annual Meeting 2022 through interactive tools and break-out sessions, as well as at the meeting of the SLOCAT Board of Directors 2019-2022. An open survey consultation was conducted across the Partnership from May to June, followed by a series of one-on-one interviews with our Partners over the Summer. The process continued with a meeting of the SLOCAT Board of Directors 2022-2025 in October and further bilateral sessions between the Secretariat and Board Members during that month. After the second partnership-wide consultation in January, the draft Plan was submitted for the Board's final consideration and eventual adoption at its meeting on the 31st January 2023.

Six Actions to Enable Walking, Cycling and Public Transport for People and Planet: A Call to Action by SLOCAT

In order to reach the 1.5°C target of the Paris Agreement and provide equitable access to transport and mobility for all, the urgent transformation of transport is necessary. At the Glasgow Climate Conference - COP26, Parties and non-Party stakeholders came together around pledges on a number of fronts, from scaled up action on emissions from aviation and shipping, to the electrification of a range of vehicles, including cars, vans and medium- to heavy-duty vehicles. While these efforts are essential to bringing the world in line with the 1.5°C target, much more needs to be done to not only bring emissions from transport systems down to zero and scale up their resilience, but also to guarantee equitable access to transport and mobility systems that truly leave no one and no place behind. Walking, cycling and public transport hold the key to many of the solutions needed to achieve these goals through a just transition. Still, they are under-prioritised aspects of the climate agenda, from a policy and funding perspective.

At COP27 Sharmel-Sheikh, the SLOCAT Partnership called on governments at all levels, multilateral organisations, international financial institutions and national development banks to meaningfully scale up walking, cycling and public transport systems, particularly in the Global South. These stakeholders must act to enable walking, cycling and public transport solutions as core elements of their climate action for transport by specific, measurable, attainable, relevant and time-based action in six areas:



Prioritising the promotion, support and scale up of walking, cycling and public transport, as well as the decoupling of economic growth and private car use, with tailored educational, policy and funding measures.





Investing in infrastructure that enables walking, cycling and public transport, by, among other actions, reallocating existing funding from fossil fuel subsidies.



Implementing integrated land and transport design and planning, with robust safeguards for healthy, gender sensitive, pro-poor and disabilities-conscious impacts so these modes effectively become the most convenient options for most trips.



Involving multidisciplinary health experts in the development and implementation of walking, cycling and public transport policy.



Enhancing coordination among different tiers of government, as well as the technical and financial capacities of sub-national and local governments to help cities and communities realise this shift in design, planning, funding and implementation.





Evidence and Advocacy for Phasing out Fossil Fuel Subsidies and Investments in Transport


SLOCAT Analysis of SDGs Voluntary National Reviews 2022

Since the first UN High-Level Political Forum on Sustainable Development in 2016, SLOCAT has been assessing transport references in the VNRs submitted each year by countries.

The SLOCAT Report on Transport and 2022 Voluntary National Reviews (VNRs) analyses in detail how countries are reporting transport measures in their 2022 reviews about the implementation of the SDGs. This eighth edition of this SLOCAT flagship analysis is showing that a number of 2022 VNRs highlight sustainable transport actions in the context of COVID-19 pandemic recovery and the urgent transition to renewables from fossil fuels. However, most 2022 VNRs only describe the adverse impacts of the ongoing crises instead of presenting concrete policy measures. And when they do, the measures do not fully address the urgent systemic transformations necessary to enable equitable access to transport and mobility for all. The report concludes with four recommendations for countries to optimise the use of transport and mobility measures in support of the implementation of the SDGs at the national and sub-national levels.







Financial Update: Letter from the Treasurer of the SLOCAT Board of Directors

Dear Fellow SLOCAT Partners,

In my capacity as Treasurer in the SLOCAT Board of Directors 2022 - 2025, I have the pleasure to present to you updates on the state of SLOCAT's finances and highlight some positive achievements.

Current Financial Year 2022-2023 (from 1 July 2022 to 31 January 2023)

- During the first seven months of this financial year, the SLOCAT secretariat has maintained a balanced budget between expenses and income, fully covering its July 2022 - January 2023 expenses with the income generated or allocated for this period.
- In addition to the income generated during this period, the starting bank balance and funding received for future periods have formed a stable cash-flow situation for the organisation.
- From July 2022 to January 2023, the SLOCAT secretariat has utilised 51.39% of its projected expenses.
- We have a good outlook for the remainder of the fiscal year. Current estimates indicate that expenses will be fully covered by income generated or allocated for Financial Year 2022-2023.
- This is a significant step in the consolidation of the medium-term financial stability that SLOCAT initiated in the past couple of years.
- Any potential reserve maintained at the end of the fiscal year will be used for institutional strengthening and furthering
 the incremental buildup of reserves. Annual Support Fees received from SLOCAT Partners still constitute the most
 flexible funding source the Partnership has. On behalf of the SLOCAT Board of Directors, partners are kindly encouraged
 to maintain this support. Our warm gratitude is extended to partners doing so over the years.

Previous Financial Year 2021-2022 (from 1 July 2021 to 30 June 2022)

The overview for Financial Year 2021-2022 presents 100% coverage of the expenses, 96,73% secured by income from fees and grants and the remaining by the surplus of the previous year. Total expenses amounted to \$1,256,173 and total income received or receivable under signed contracts amounted to \$1,215,129; leading to a gap of \$41,044. This deviation results primarily from the very high costs incurred for outsourced accounting services in order to overcome the legacy of outstanding annual reviews of several past financial years since 2017. SLOCAT has now cleared this legacy backlog and counts with externally reviewed accounts for all past financial years that can be publicly shared and produced at funders' and partners' request. Part of the USD 232,396 surplus from the previous Financial Year 2020-2021 will be partially used to fill the gap.

After carefully considering internal and external factors, the Board of Directors has unanimously approved the change of the Functional currency from USD to EUR. The final Annual Financial Report for Financial Year 2021-2022 to be prepared by the external accounting company will be presented in EUR.

As this is my first communication as Treasurer, I would like to take this opportunity to express my admiration to the entire SLOCAT community for the common goal and shared passion over the years; as well as my trust and support to the SLOCAT secretariat for the commitment and achievements in enabling an impactful horizon for our Partnership.
