- Expectations from the COP29 Presidency::
 - Parties to submit ambitious plans and targets with Nationally
 Determined Contributions and National Adaptation Plans.
 - Global financial institutions and the largest economies in the G7 and G20 to signal their commitment to enhance ambition and enable action in their respective meetings and summits.
- Heads of delegation meeting in July in Azerbaijan to advance discussions on the new climate finance goal and other items in the agenda

Unpacking the positive and negative impacts of low and zero emission transport technologies 3 June 2024

Organised in collaboration with ITF and SLOCAT as Marrakech Partnership Focal Points for transport:

Loss and damage: Resilience of and through transport

Guidance on investments needs and opportunities for resilience of and through transport in relation to the Loss and Damage
Fund established at COP28 (decisions 2/CP.27 and 2/CMA.4)

Transport events on the COP29 programme

- **Decision on overall programme** for the two weeks and thematic days and is **pending**.
- Strong support for a Cities, Transport and Tourism Thematic Day and Transport Ministerial Meeting.
- Urban Ministerial Meeting appears to be confirmed.
 - Possibility of thematic focuses including urban mobility.
- Presidency initiatives are planned. More information later this month.

#FossilFreeTransport

A call to double the share of energy efficient and fossil-free forms of land transport by 2030

Last year, in the run up to the COP28, we launched a call to urge robust action to double the share of energy efficient and fossil-free forms of land transport for people and goods by 2030. Due to its near complete dependence on fossil fuels and the growing demand for transport, without a paradigm shift, emissions, air pollution and energy demand from the land transport sector will continue rising. To reverse this trend and achieve the decarbonised and sustainability pathways called for at COP28, we urgently need worldwide transformations both in how people and goods are moved and how transport systems are powered. The message from over 60 multistakeholder signatories of the call to action including Chile and Colombia is clear. Action should focus on shifts to public transport, walking, cycling and rail freight, as well as electric vehicles and railways; while drastically scaling up the consumption of renewable energy and zero emission energy sources, towards fossil-free land transport by 2050.

This call dovetails with what countries agreed to at COP28, namely to "accelerate the reduction of emissions from road transport on a range of pathways, including through the development of infrastructure and rapid deployment of zero-and low-emission vehicles". They also agreed to transition away from fossil fuels, tripling renewable energy capacity globally and doubling the global average annual rate of energy efficiency improvements by 2030.

Now is the time to move from pledges to 2030 targets and measures in the next generation of Nationally Determined Contributions (NDCs) that can pragmatically put us on a 1.5°C pathway

2030 Climate Solutions: Avoid-Shift announcement

The **2030 Climate Solutions** present an Implementation Roadmap to halve global emissions, address adaptation gaps, and enhance the resilience of 4 billion vulnerable people by 2030.

Informed by non-Party stakeholders, these solutions focus on scalable measures and identifying current gaps, aiming to limit warming to 1.5°C and mobilize finance, capacity building, and technology over the next seven years.

SLOCAT and ITF OECD as co-focal points of the Transport Thematic Group presented at the Marrakech partnership workshop held at the Bonn sessions a proposal for a new 2030 Climate Solution to double the share of energy efficient and fossil fuel free forms of transport, with a focus on a modal shift to public transport, walking and cycling, and rail-based freight, underpinned by electric vehicles and railways

- Avoid-Shift in the 2030 Climate Solutions 2030 target is work in progress
- Complement the Improve 2030 Climate Solutions (aviation, shipping and road transport).

The mandate of the Climate Champions Team is to enhance ambition and bolster the involvement of non-State actors in assisting Parties, collaborating with the Marrakech Partnership to achieve the goals of the Paris Agreement.

2024 visions and priorities

- **Equality:** Ensure equal voice for all, building on inclusion, regional climate action, and just climate finance.
- **Business Engagement:** Make the transition an economic opportunity for all, with businesses supporting ambitious NDCs.
- Nature: Halt deforestation, empower Indigenous peoples, and align international nature and climate agendas.
- Transition from Fossil Fuels: Reduce fossil fuel use, triple renewable energy, double energy efficiency, and build a resilient economy.
- **Equitable Finance:** Mobilise investment in climate solutions for emerging economies, scale up finance for adaptation and nature, and promote innovative finance efforts.

Marrakech Partnership: work programme 2024

- Mobilise NPS: Engage non-Party stakeholders (NPS) in setting credible, transparent, science-based goals to boost
 ambition, especially in emerging markets and developing economies. Ensure campaigns, tools, and finance are accessible
 to all.
- **Drive Systems Transformation**: Activate NPS globally to accelerate the 2030 Climate Solutions, a unified roadmap for mitigation and adaptation, enhancing NDCs.
- Strengthen Collaboration with Governments:
 - o Identify where NPS actions enhance ambition and implementation, engage NPS in UNFCCC processes, and support national climate strategies.
 - o Involve NPS in dialogues and events to support mitigation efforts and align on COP 28 UAE Consensus.
 - o Collaborate on adaptation finance to build resilience through the Sharm El Sheikh Adaptation Agenda.
- **Broaden and Deepen Global Engagement**: Increase regional representation, especially from emerging economies, to enhance climate action through regionalisation efforts.
- **Track Progress and Enhance Transparency**: Work with partners to monitor 2030 Climate Solutions and ensure accountability through the Global Climate Action portal.
- **Build a Shared Narrative**: Amplify leading NPS solutions and innovations to inspire global climate action, showcasing examples and early benefits.
