#FossilFreeTransport

A call to double the share of energy efficient and fossil-free forms of land transport by 2030

Last year, in the run up to the COP28, we launched a call to urge robust action to double the share of energy efficient and fossil-free forms of land transport for people and goods by 2030. Due to its near complete dependence on fossil fuels and the growing demand for transport, without a paradigm shift, emissions, air pollution and energy demand from the land transport sector will continue rising. To reverse this trend and achieve the decarbonised and sustainability pathways called for at COP28, we urgently need worldwide transformations both in how people and goods are moved and how transport systems are powered. The message from over 60 multistakeholder signatories of the call to action including Chile and Colombia is clear. Action should focus on shifts to public transport, walking, cycling and rail freight, as well as electric vehicles and railways; while drastically scaling up the consumption of renewable energy and zero emission energy sources, towards fossil-free land transport by 2050.

This call dovetails with what countries agreed to at COP28, namely to "accelerate the reduction of emissions from road transport on a range of pathways, including through the development of infrastructure and rapid deployment of zero-and low-emission vehicles". They also agreed to transition away from fossil fuels, tripling renewable energy capacity globally and doubling the global average annual rate of energy efficiency improvements by 2030.

The 2024 Action Agenda: Enhanced ambition, capacity and finance

Ahead of COP29, as countries prepare their next Nationally Determined Contributions (NDCs 3.0), our 2024 Action Agenda is focusing on what it will take to deliver on the global commitments agreed at COP28 through ambitious and feasible transport targets and measures in NDCs 3.0.

To put transport on a 1.5°C pathway, we need urgent action on ambition, finance and capacity.



2030 Climate Solutions: Avoid-Shift announcement

The **2030 Climate Solutions** present an Implementation Roadmap to halve global emissions, address adaptation gaps, and enhance the resilience of 4 billion vulnerable people by 2030.

Informed by non-Party stakeholders, these solutions focus on scalable measures and identifying current gaps, aiming to limit warming to 1.5°C and mobilize finance, capacity building, and technology over the next seven years.

SLOCAT and ITF OECD as co-focal points of the Transport Thematic Group presented at the Marrakech partnership workshop held at the Bonn sessions a proposal for a new 2030 Climate Solution to double the share of energy efficient and fossil fuel free forms of transport, with a focus on a modal shift to public transport, walking and cycling, and rail-based freight, underpinned by electric vehicles and railways

- Avoid-Shift in the 2030 Climate Solutions 2030 target is work in progress
- Complement the Improve 2030 Climate Solutions (aviation, shipping and road transport).



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
