What are national focal points?

National focal points are local or regional experts that volunteer to provide information about a certain country or region. Their names, expertise and organisation will be collected [in this list](#). It is envisioned to have multiple people per country as they might provide different types of data and aren't aware of activities in all areas.

Their contribution will be acknowledged by including their names and organisation in the acknowledgement section of the next TCC-GSR. They will be kept informed about the progress of the TCC-GSR (development, peer-review, webinars, events etc.). They will be invited to events in their regions and might be invited as experts. The list of national focal points will be shared with key partners (such as GIZ and others) and can lead to more opportunities.

What kind of information will be asked?

Information are mainly needed to feed into the policy landscapes of the TCC-GSR:

- Sustainable Mobility Planning and Transport Demand Management;
- Urban Public Transport;
- Railways;
- Walking and Cycling;
- New Mobility Services;
- Fuel Economy;
- Electric Mobility;
- and Renewable Energy in Transport.

In addition, the national focal points will be asked to provide information on:

- Climate Change (information about emission reductions/increases, policies and targets related to transport with the main objective to mitigate or adapt to climate change);
- Aviation (focuses on domestic and international aviation);
- Shipping (focuses on domestic and international shipping);
- Finance (focuses mainly on transport infrastructure, funding for resilience).

The national focal points will be invited to provide **data and/or policies**:

1. Data

The SLoCaT Secretariat needs data-sets about transport to illustrate in the TCC-GSR. In their countries/regions will be requested to submit to the SLoCaT Secretariat. The data can come from national yearbooks, statistic portals, scientific articles or grey literature. Subnational data about transport in major cities is also welcome and can be submitted. The data will be integrated into global data-sets or individual data in the TraKB, transformed to indicators and put into visualisations for the report.

2. Policies

For this second type of information, the SLoCaT Secretariat seeks to collect transport policies implemented in 2019 and 2020 as well as policies targets set during the same time period (the implementation year might be later in the future). The first iteration of the TCC-GSR included 180 policies from 70 countries. A great diversity in terms of countries and transport modes is envisioned for the next TCC-GSR.

How will the national focal points be engaged?

After being included in the list of national focal points, they will be informed about the envisioned information and when we plan to collect them. The information will be collected through surveys.

When will the national focal points be asked for information?

The overall objective is to produce the next TCC-GSR by December 2020. The overall process of the TCC-GSR requires data-collection, production and peer-review. The national focal points will have opportunities for indirect engagement in such step.

The timeline for direct engagement is:
