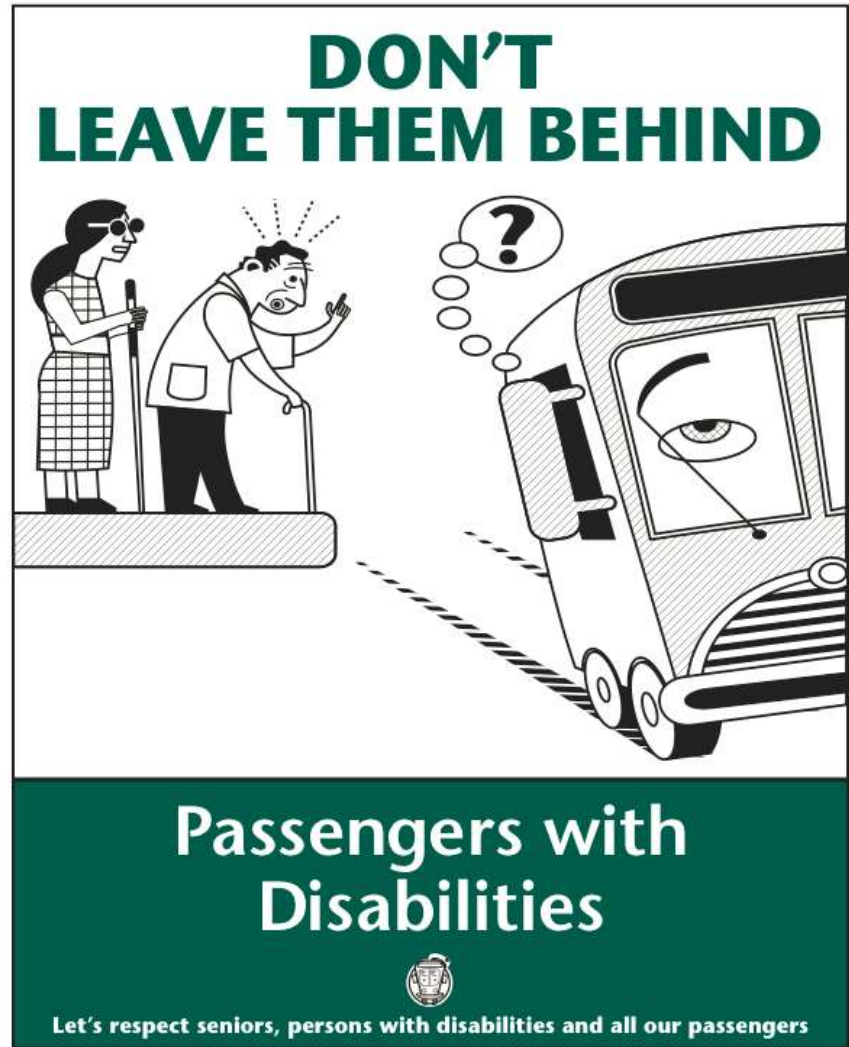

# Paradigm shift on development of Transport



**Access: (Avoid + Shift + Improve)**

(people and goods)**

Universal access incorporates the accommodation of cycling, walking, and wheelchair use into the design and regulation of every street facility by default rather than as an optional feature or afterthought <http://www.humantransport.org/universalaccess/page3.html>

# SLoCaT Submission to Open Working Group on Sustainable Development Goals

## Universal Access to Safe, Clean and Affordable Energy and Transport for All

Target

Urban households are able to access jobs, goods and services within 30 minutes by public transport and/or walking and cycling and rural households have access to all weather roads;

Access  
Economic

Target

Traffic related deaths are cut in half by 2025 with an ultimate vision of near zero fatalities;

Social

Target

Air pollution from passenger and freight transport is halved by 2025 and GHG emissions from transport peak globally latest by 2020 with an ultimate vision of 40-60% reductions by 2050 compared to 2005 levels.

- Include Sustainable Transport in Sustainable Development Goals
- Adopt Sustainable Transport targets, including universal access, in SDGs
- Strengthen collection, analysis, reporting of disability data and mobility needs

- Include persons with disabilities in development planning & implementation
