**Interactive Dialogue with Major Groups and other Stakeholders**

**Draft scenario**

The Co-Facilitators of the post-2015 process, H.E. Ambassador Macharia Kamau (Kenya) and H.E. Ambassador David Donoghue (Ireland), will convene an interactive dialogue with Major Groups and other stakeholders on **Thursday, 19 February 2015 from 10:00am-1:00 pm**, during the February session of the intergovernmental negotiations on the post-2015 development agenda (17-20 February 2015).

The objective of this interactive dialogue would be to provide an opportunity for representatives of Major Groups and other stakeholders to comment on the paper containing draft elements for the Declaration on the post-2015 development agenda as well as to react to the comments and interventions made by Member States during the preceding days. In order to encourage a dialogue with Member States, representatives of Member States would be periodically given the opportunity to respond and react to the interventions made by the Major Groups and other stakeholders. Speakers will be asked to respond to the following guiding questions for their interventions on each particular section of the elements paper:

- 1) What are your two main points of feedback on the draft elements for the Declaration?
- 2) What are your two key recommendations for achieving an inspirational Declaration?

Based on interest expressed by Major Groups and other civil society stakeholders through an online google doc at <http://bit.ly/Feb-p2015-nominations-received>, the 16-member February stakeholder steering committee has selected [21 speakers](#) representing the Major Groups and other stakeholders, ensuring regional, constituency and gender balance while also bringing a diversity of voices and expertise to the process. ***A strict time limit of 2 minutes should be observed for each intervention. The text of interventions should be submitted to DESA-DSD and UN-NGLS (email: [lavan@un.org](mailto:lavan@un.org)) by 5:00pm on Wednesday, 18 February so that copies can be made for translators.***
